## Context

Mission Australia (MA) is a non-denominational Christian community service organisation that has been helping people regain their independence for over 155 years. Throughout that time, MA's founding purpose has been expressed as 'Inspired by Jesus Christ, Mission Australia exists to meet human need and to spread the knowledge of the love of God'.

Our nationwide team, of almost 2,500 staff and around 1,100 volunteers, offers a wide range of solutions over the long term, including through early learning and youth services, extensive family support and homelessness initiatives, employment skills development, and the provision of affordable housing. Importantly, we're all guided by a single objective – to stand together with Australians in need, until they can stand for themselves.

The MA 2020-2025 strategic plan charts the strategic direction for MA's commitments and policy directions. MA services are delivered in partnership with federal, state and local governments and with a range of corporate and community organisations, to make a real difference to the well-being of Australians in need.

MA is continuing to develop the way it delivers services to individuals and communities through a well-connected, flexible and responsive service delivery model. This transition requires significant governance reform and strategic financial management.

Each year MA brings together a range of services for around 150,000 people around Australia who are economically and socially vulnerable in the community (including the homeless, the addicted, the abused, young people, families, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, the unemployed, people with disabilities, and the ageing).

Tenure	Directors must retire at each Annual General Meeting with those longest in office selected by rotation. They are eligible for re-election. Directors must retire after the age of 72, unless otherwise agreed.

The Board normally meets face-to-face 4 or 5 times per year in Sydney, and in short (1-2 hour) teleconference updates a further 5-6 times.
